

ATI program helps 13 companies relocate to Austin in 2011

The Austin Technology Incubator's Land Pad Program supported more than a dozen companies in relocating to Austin during its first formal year in 2011, the not-for-profit program announced Monday.

The 13 companies that now call Austin home include Amatra, BlackLocus, Convergence Wireless, Digital Harmony Games, Drive, DXUp Close, SceneTap, Social Muse, **Tactical Information Systems** and V-Chain Solutions. Atlanta entrepreneur [Ben Dyer](#) brought TechDrawl to Austin, and has since helped launch and relocate two new startups: NightRaft and [BeHome247 Inc.](#)

The Landing Pad Program supports early stage technology companies by leveraging ATI's network and community insight to accelerate that company's acculturation into the Austin business ecosystem.
