Texas A&M to unveil Round Rock campus

Texas A&M Health Science Center will unveil the first building of its new, 50-acre Round Rock campus during a ribbon cutting ceremony on Thursday.

The building includes educational and clinic space, administrative offices and a simulation center equipped with computer-programmed human manikins.

The afternoon event will be attended by the university's System Chancellor Michael McKinney, Texas A&M Health Science Center President Nancy Dickey and members of the Texas A&M System Board of Regents. State Sen. Steve Ogden, R-District 5; State Rep. Dan Gattis, R-District 20; and State Rep. Diana Maldonado, D-District 52 are also scheduled to appear.

The health science center at Round Rock offers programs from the College of Medicine and the College of Pharmacy. Eventually, the center will also include programs from the College of Nursing and the School of Rural Public Health.
